Pulaski County Fiscal Court met in a regular called meeting at 10 am on Tuesday, January 24, 2023 with Marshall Todd presiding. The following magistrates were present:

(1) Motion made by Magistrate Wilson and seconded by Magistrate Wheeldon to approve the minutes from the last court meeting held January 10. Motion carried.	
(2) Motion made by Magistrate Ranshaw and seconded by Magistrate Turpen to open a new bank account as a pass through for the FAHE project, this will be a housing revolving fund. Motion carried.	
(3) Motion made by Magistrate Ranshaw and seconded by Magistrate Turpen to accept the bids from Styker Medical in the amount of \$258,113.04 for eight (8) Cot Lifts and five (5) Powered CPR Devices for the amount of \$119,512.95. These amounts reflect a provision of credits on trading in used equipment. Motion carried.	
(4) Motion made by Magistrate Ranshaw and seconded by Magistrate Turpen to allow Judge Todd permission to apply for any available grants moving forward. Motion carried.

	(11) Motion made by Magistrate Wilson and seconded by Magistrate Strunk to advertise for a new full body scanner for the Detention Center. Motion carried.	
	(12) Motion made by Magistrate Strunk and seconded by Magistrate Wilson to allow the Detention Center to enter into a feasibility study with CMW in Lexington. The cost of this study will be covered by a grant. Motion carried.
